

The Fatty Boo Exhibition

Bob Glynn and Aubrey Robinson at Monster Truck, 10th – 15th June 2010



The Fatty Boo Exhibition is a joint show by two Dublin based visual artists, Bob Glynn and Aubrey Robinson. Their work comprises imaginary landscapes drawn from new and uncertain environments and explored through painting and digital photography.

Bob Glynn combines architectural structures with landscape painting. In his work, traditional forms of landscape representation merge with isolated man-made structures to convey a sense of alienation from our environment, a sense which is countered by the seductive quality of his layering technique.

Aubrey Robinson constructs fictional environments through the use of large-scale digitally manipulated photography. His work explores themes of dilapidation and loss relating to contemporary Ireland. By combining digital photo-collage with traditional observational painting, he produces images that occupy the middle ground between the two disciplines.

The exhibition opens on the 10th of June from 6-8pm in Monster Truck Gallery, Francis Street, and runs until the 15th June, from 1- 6pm.
